Navigating Offense with Your Pastor ft. Larry Brey

As Second Chair Leaders, we are leading while also following. This week, Brandon, Lindsay Stewart, and Larry Brey discuss having a healthy, thriving, trust-anchored relationship with the person we follow and how important it is for success and longevity in ministry.

WHY HAVE YOU FOLLOWED YOUR PASTOR FOR SO MANY YEARS?

- Psalm 92:23 (NIV) "Planted in the house of the Lord, they will flourish in the courts of our God."
 - God has a place of planting for all of us.
 - It's simple faith to follow.
 - But simple faith is hard to live out.
- The sacrifice isn't meant for us to enjoy, it's meant for us to feed.
 - But when we get really hungry, we eat it rather than sow it. We consume it rather than give it.
 - The next generation becomes collateral damage if we leave before we are called to.
- We are Aarons and Hurs for Moses.

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE CONVICTIONS WE NEED TO HAVE IF WE ARE GOING TO FOLLOW OUR PASTORS IN A BIBLICALLY FAITHFUL MANNER?

- What do we do when we see our pastor's humanity?
 - You have to know how you want to respond when you see their humanity.
 - Do you cover it or expose it?
- Learning the difference between submitting and compromising.
 - We're called to submit one unto another.
 - Submit means to put your preference to the side.
 - A core conviction would be to always submit.
 - A compromise would be to take God's standard and put it aside.
- Our pastors are the under-shepherds under Christ who have been entrusted with stewardship of a local church.
 - They will be held responsible.
 - They will stand in front of God with an account from Jesus on how they stewarded the church.
 - Second chair leaders will be held accountable by how we held up the arms of our pastors.
- To those sitting in offense from their pastor/leader:
 - Some of those will be biblical grievances.
 - Most will be personal preferences.
 - No one has ever been won to the gospel by our preferences.
 - But we can become so addicted to it that it drives all of our decisions.
- The longer you're in ministry and the closer you get to your pastors, the more you see their humanity.
- We have to teach people how to deal with offense before it comes.
 - At the end of the day, pick and pluck.
 - Pick the fruit and pluck the weed.
 - Fruit: find the fruit of the day (gratitude discipline)
 - Pluck: keep an offense journal
 - Psalm 43:5 NKJV "Why so downcast oh my soul?"
 - Name it, ask the Holy Spirit what it was, and talk to someone about it if you can't get over it in 36 hours.
 - It doesn't matter where you are in the organization, you have the opportunity to be offended.

HOW DOES A SPOUSE NOT PICK UP SECONDHAND OFFENSE?

- Tell them what they need to know and don't tell them what they don't need to know.
- Keep connected and up to date.
- Work through things together but enter with maturity, knowing you're working through it.
- You need a team around you that knows everything.
 - Don't walk through tensions alone.
 - There are times when you need processing.
- Do an autopsy of where you both have made mistakes in the past and did not deal with things healthily.

IF SOMEONE IS WALKING THROUGH NOT SEEING EYE TO EYE WITH THEIR PASTOR, HOW DO THEY WALK THROUGH IT AND DEAL WITH IT WITHOUT A DEFIANT TONE?

- Frustration always happens with unmet expectations.
 - Clarity is kindness.
 - Step into the awkward and get clarity on expectations.
